

# RONALD REAGAN CORRIDOR PLANNING SEGMENTS (Williams Dr to SH 195)

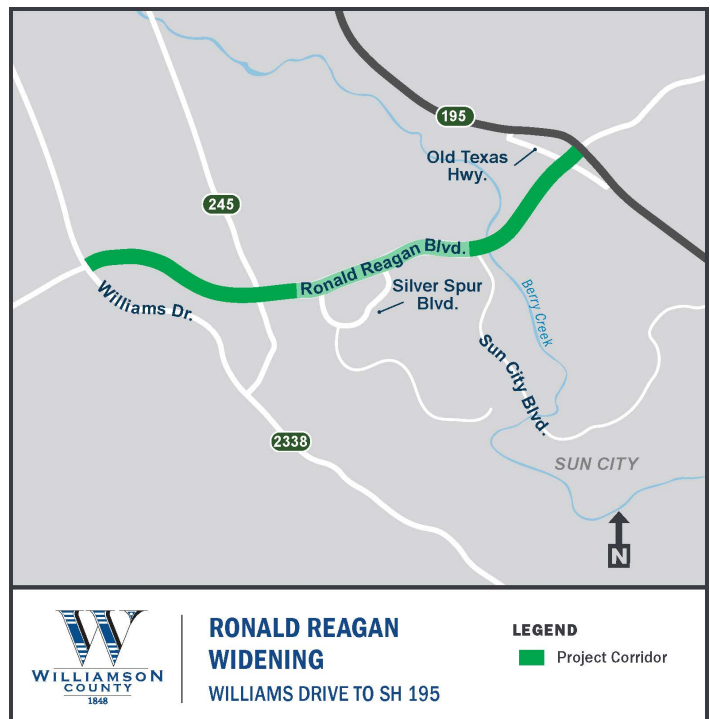
**County Commissioners:** Commissioner Valerie Covey, Precinct 3  
**Project Limits and Length:** 5 miles on Ronald Reagan Boulevard from Williams Drive to SH 195  
**Project Schedule:** Planning to be finalized in early 2022. There is currently no funding for construction.  
**Issues to be addressed:** Safety and mobility, expanding north-south and east-west connectivity, providing an alternative to I-35  
**Project Engineer:** Rodriguez Transportation Group

## PROJECT PURPOSE:

Williamson County is conducting a study to plan for widening the existing Ronald Reagan Boulevard between Williams Drive and SH 195. This proposed expansion will accommodate future increased traffic on the roadway and provide safety improvements. These improvements would include turn lanes, divided roadways, and shoulders in both directions to enhance safety for the motoring public. Once construction funding is identified and the growth necessitates additional lanes, the first phase of the project would include making the existing road northbound only and building a separate two-lane road to serve as the southbound frontage road. Ultimately, as the county grows and funding is secured, mainlanes will be built resulting in an eight-lane controlled access roadway.

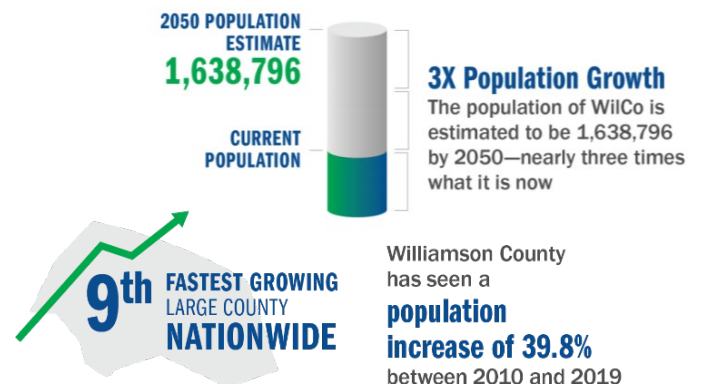
Ronald Reagan Boulevard is a part of the County's Long-Range Transportation Plan and while there is no funding for construction, the County is working to preserve right of way (ROW) before property values make the improvements cost prohibitive. Early preservation of ROW allows the County to take a phased approach and build sections of the road as needed.

Williamson County has experienced immense growth in recent years and current population projections predict that this growth will continue. Transportation planning to keep pace with growth is the County's responsibility. Additional lanes are required to improve connectivity, mobility and safety for residents, ultimately protecting their quality of life.
