

# **RONALD REAGAN WIDENING PROJECT**

FACT SHEET

**County Commissioners:** Commissioner Cynthia Long, Precinct 2 & Commissioner Valerie Covey, Precinct 3

Project Limits and Length: 7 miles on Ronald Reagan Boulevard from FM 3405 to SH 29

Design to be finalized in summer 2021 with construction beginning in late 2021. **Project Schedule:** 

Completion anticipated for late 2023.

Issues to be addressed: Safety and mobility, expanding north-south connectivity

**Project Engineer:** CP&Y, Inc.

### **PROJECT PURPOSE:**

Williamson County will be widening Ronald Reagan Boulevard between FM 3405 and SH 29. This project will accommodate increased traffic on the roadway and provide safety improvements. The existing roadway will ultimately become northbound only, after a separate two-lane road is built that will serve southbound traffic. The project will include turn lanes, divided roadways, and shoulders in both directions to improve safety for the motoring public. The Ronald Reagan Widening project is a part of the County's Long-Range Transportation Plan and will be funded through the voter-approved 2019 Williamson County Road Bond.

#### WHY THE PROJECT IS NEEDED:

Williamson County has experienced immense growth in recent years and current population projections predict that this growth will continue. Transportation planning to keep pace with growth is the County's responsibility. Additional lanes are required to improve connectivity, mobility and safety for residents, ultimately protecting their quality of life.
