

# CR 129 PROJECT

## FACT SHEET

Updated March 2021

**County Commissioner:** Commissioner Russ Boles, Precinct 4  
**Project Limits:** South of Brushy Creek to North of the Southern Williamson County Line  
**Project Status:** Project design expected to be complete summer 2021, followed by right-of-way acquisition; construction anticipated to begin in spring 2022.  
**Issues to Be Addressed:** Safety and mobility issues; limited sight distance at the top of the hill  
**Project Engineer:** Garver


### PROJECT OVERVIEW:

Williamson County is planning for the reconstruction of CR 129 from south of Brushy Creek to just north of the southern Williamson County line. The existing CR 129 roadway is two 10-foot lanes (one lane in each direction) with no shoulders.


Improvements to CR 129 will include:

- Adjusting hill elevation to address sight distance issues
- Widening lanes from 10 feet to 11 feet
- Adding two-foot shoulders on either side of the road


### EXISTING CR 129



### PROPOSED CR 129



## WHY THE PROJECT IS NEEDED:

Due to elevation differences, CR 129 has limited sight distance for drivers approaching the hill. This poses a safety concern for drivers along CR 129. By constructing these improvements, Williamson County is protecting the safety of its residents, and ultimately, their quality of life.



### **Stopping Sight Distance:**

The distance a driver needs to be able to see to stop and avoid colliding with something in the roadway.

## TIMELINE AND NEXT STEPS:

- **Summer 2020**
  - Begin project design
  - Collect technical and environmental data
- **Fall/Winter 2020**
  - Refine proposed design
  - Identify right-of-way (ROW) needs
- **Spring 2021**
  - Complete project design
  - Begin ROW acquisition
- **Spring 2022**
  - Anticipated construction start
- **Fall 2022**
  - Anticipated construction completion
