**ORDER TERMINATING
OUTDOOR BURNING BAN**

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Commissioners Court found at its session on **August 25, 2020** that circumstances presented in all of the unincorporated area of Williamson County creating a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning and authorized the County Judge to sign a Burn Ban Order that prohibited outdoor burning for ninety (90) days and, further, if the County Judge determined that circumstances present in the unincorporated areas of Williamson County no longer created a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning, the County Judge was authorized to terminate the Burn Ban prior to the ninetieth (90th) day following the adoption of the Burn Ban;

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Office of Emergency Management and the Williamson County Fire Marshal has informed the County Judge that circumstances present in the unincorporated areas of Williamson County no longer create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning and has recommended and requested that the County Judge terminate the Burn Ban prior to its ninety (90) day expiration period; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ORDERED, based on the request and recommendation of the Williamson County Office of Emergency Management and the Williamson County Fire Marshal, the County Judge hereby terminates the Burn Ban adopted on **August 25, 2020** and such termination shall be effective as of **12:00 p.m. on September 4, 2020**.
